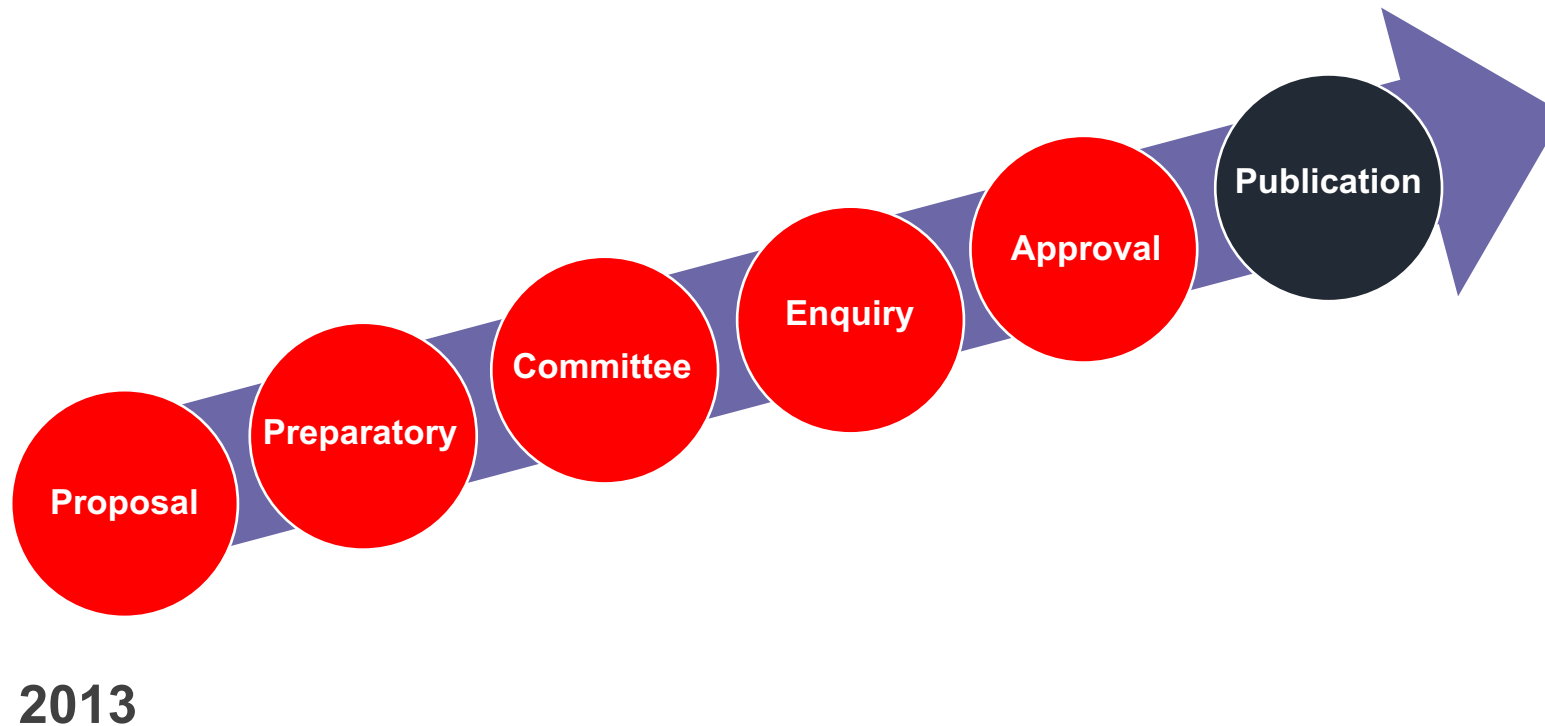

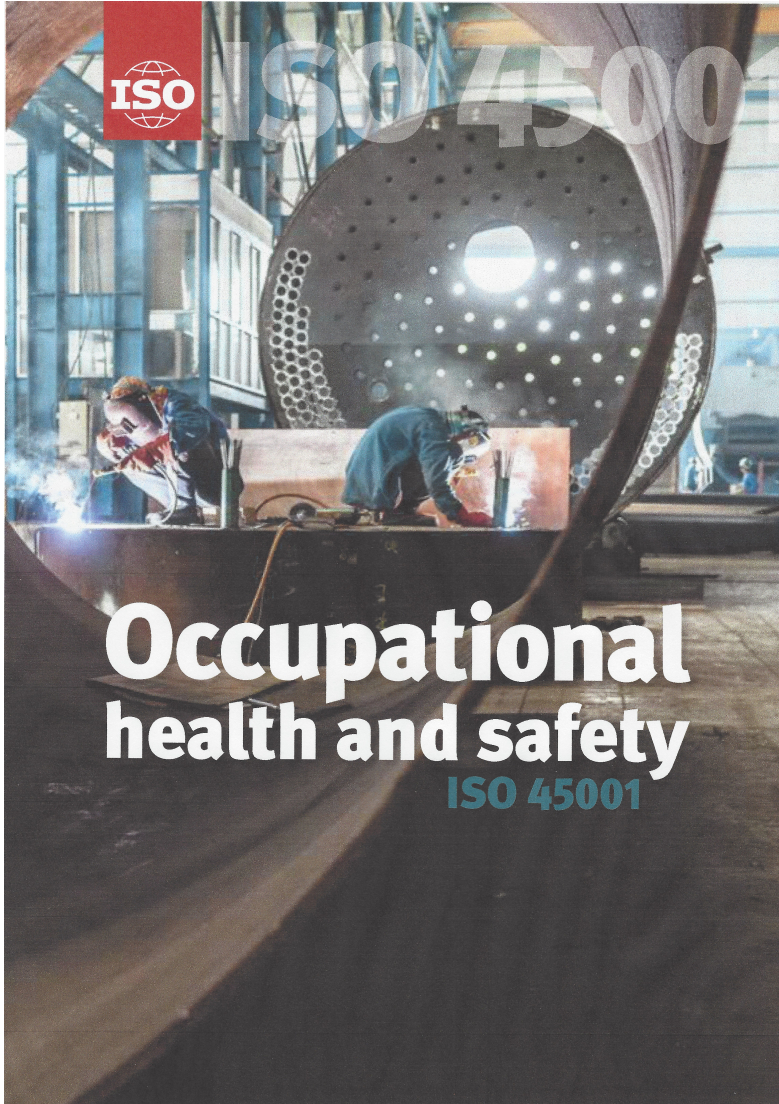

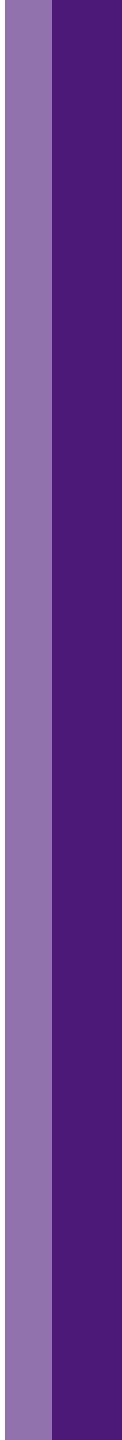

ISO 45001

Why is a new standard needed?

- Global toll of safety and health failures
 - OHSAS 18001 – well used, but not an agreed international standard
 - Alignment with other management standards
- 

ISO 45001

Global toll

- 2.78 million people killed by work accidents and disease
- 7,600 deaths per day (~ one every 12 seconds)
- 374 million non-fatal work accidents
- 2.4 million people killed by occupational disease
- ~ 4% of world GDP = work accidents and diseases

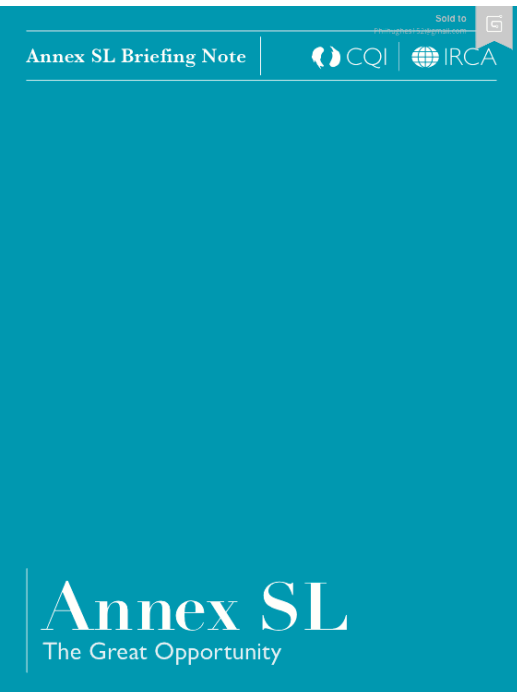
Benefits of safety and health management

- Humanitarian (less work-related injury, illness and death)
- Business:
 - productivity and profitability
 - customer and worker loyalty
 - reputation, resilience and results

ISO 45001

Standardising the standards

- ‘Annex SL’ to develop/revise standards
 - Same high-level structure (clause titles/sequence)
 - Identical core text (+ topic variations)
 - Commons terms and definitions
- Aims to:
 - reduce confusion/inconsistency
 - enable integration of multiple certifications

- 1 Scope
- 2 Normative references
- 3 Terms and definitions
- 4 Context of the organization

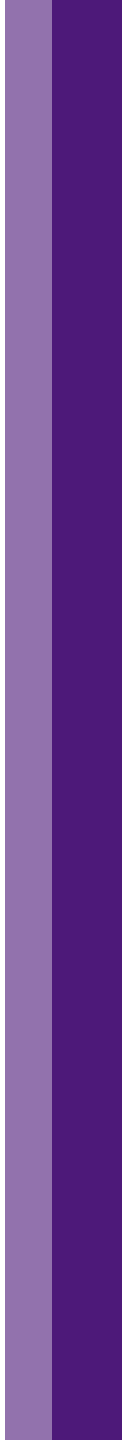
- 5 Leadership [and worker participation] – commitment, policy, roles, responsibilities, accountabilities, authorities and consultation

- 6 Planning – setting objectives and the actions needed to achieve them.



ISO 45001

ISO 45001 clauses

- 8 Support – resources, competence, awareness, communication, documented information.
 - 9 Operation – operational planning and action (including management of change, outsourcing, procurement and contractors, emergency preparedness).
 - 10 Performance evaluation – measuring and monitoring, internal audits and management review
 - 11 Improvement – setting targets, investigating incidents and non-conformities, and taking corrective actions.

ISO 45001 vs OHSAS 18001

- Context
- Leadership
- Documented information
- More on
 - worker participation
 - continual improvement
 - hierarchy of control
 - risk and opportunities
 - compliance status
 - supply chain
 - KPIs

What ISO 45001 is NOT

- No specific criteria for OH&S performance.
- Is not prescriptive about the design of an OH &S management system
- Does not cover product safety, property damage or environmental impacts, unless they are a risk to workers
- Is not a legally binding document, it is a management tool for **voluntary** use by organizations from SME's upwards.



ISO 45001

What about Brexit will this change ISO 45001 and it's implementation?

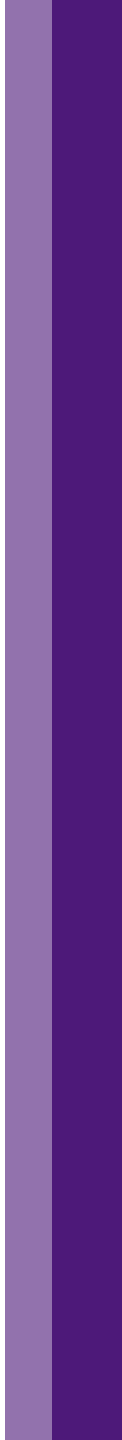
No - it is a Global standard from the ISO not the EU

No - It is a voluntary standard and is unaffected by EU or UK Health & Safety Law
