• Broadly are still flatlining




Headlines – fatals (all industry)

- In 2017/18 there were:
 - ≻144 workers killed
 - >100 Members of Public (86 service industries, 6 construction)
 - Slight increase from 2016/17


>555,000 Non fatal injuries

- Of which 71,062 were employer reported employee injuries





Safety Advisors Bugbears – Wood dust

COSHH – prevent • exposure to known carcinogens and causes of asthma i.e. Wood dust • LEV is reasonably practicable And it fits on powered hand tools

Safety Advisors Bugbears – Fire

- Means of Raising the Alarm Advertised as "This old school fire alarm has been improved"
- The advanced versions come with a trolley to hold extinguishers





Safety Advisors Bugbears – Fire



- The law says suitable and sufficient means of raising the alarm and initial fire fighting!
- Wired or wireless linked alarms likely to be appropriate
- Types of extinguisher relevant to risks and site plan



• Temporary Works come in all shapes and sizes

- Site fencing
- Cabins- single or double stacked?
- Pedestrian walkways
- Excavations- Batter, shore
- Temporary supports

All to be **designed** by temporary works engineer, **installed** by competent contractor in accordance with the written plan and **maintained**





Safety Advisors Bugbears – Work at Height – Rescue Plan (Regulation 4)

The regulations state that "every employer shall ensure that work at height is properly planned" and "planning of work includes planning for emergencies and rescue".

- Several types of emergencies could arise
- Its is not acceptable to just call 999

Safety Advisors Bugbears – Work at Height – Rescue Plan (Regulation 4)

- Communication
- Emergency contacts
- Rescuers safety and equipment
- Suspension syncope
- First Aid

- Perimeter fencing
 - Non climbable
 - Continuous and stable
 - Maintained
- Segregation
 - Time and distance
- Scaffold
